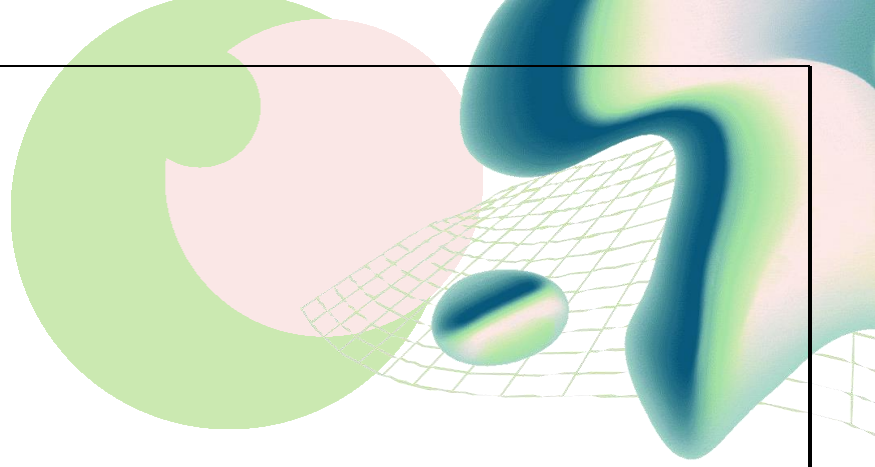

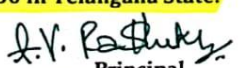

Strengthening Research and Academics

Research and Publications

During the academic year 2024–2025, the faculty members of Nizam College made significant contributions to research and scholarly activities. A total of **79 research papers** were published in reputed journals, reflecting the institution's commitment to academic excellence and research development. Faculty members also presented their research findings at various academic forums, with **6 papers published in National Conferences** and **5 papers published in International Conferences**.

The faculty further contributed to academic literature through the publication of **30 books authored** and **4 book chapters authored** during the year. These achievements highlight the active involvement of the faculty in knowledge creation and dissemination.

In the area of innovation and intellectual property, the college achieved **one patent grant** during the academic year, demonstrating the institution's growing focus on research innovation and applied knowledge.

Academic Schedule

The academic year 2024–2025 commenced with the start of undergraduate classes in July 2024, followed by structured academic sessions and examinations conducted as per the university schedule. Postgraduate programmes also followed a systematic academic calendar ensuring timely completion of syllabus and assessments.

New Programmes

During the academic year, the college introduced a **B.Com. Finance programme**, aimed at providing specialized knowledge in finance and preparing students for careers in banking, investment, and corporate sectors.

Collaborations

The institution strengthened its academic and research network through **18 active Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs)** with national and international organizations.

Inclusive Education

The college continued its efforts to support students from educationally backward sections through reservation policies, scholarships, mentoring, and academic support.

Discipline and Governance

The institution maintained a disciplined environment through structured committees such as Anti-Ragging Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, and Internal Complaints Committee.

Student Performance

The analysis of student performance during the academic year 2024–2025 indicates satisfactory academic outcomes across undergraduate programmes such as B.A., B.Com., B.Sc., B.B.A., and B.C.A. The overall pass percentages reflect steady academic progress and demonstrate the effectiveness of the teaching-learning and evaluation processes adopted by the institution.

Scholarships

A total of **3,235 students** received scholarships amounting to **₹3, 51, 77, 500** primarily from the State Government, supporting students from diverse socio-economic backgrounds.

Nizam College undertook a wide range of student welfare initiatives focusing on academic development, social awareness, health, and cultural engagement.

Capacity Building Programs

Guest Lecture by the Department

The Department of Sociology organized a Guest Lecture on 9th January 2025 to provide students with academic exposure beyond the classroom. The lecture focused on contemporary social issues and encouraged students to develop critical thinking and analytical perspectives. Faculty members and students engaged in interactive discussions, making the session informative and intellectually enriching.

The workshop featured expert sessions by Dr. A. Rama Krishna, Professor Emeritus, School of Education, Osmania University, and Dr. J. Lalitha, School of Education, Osmania University. The sessions focused on curriculum planning, assessment methods, and student learning outcomes aligned with higher education standards. Faculty members actively participated in the workshop and gained valuable insights into effective academic practices and innovative teaching methodologies for the successful implementation of OBE in higher education institutions.

Promoting Alumni Engagement
